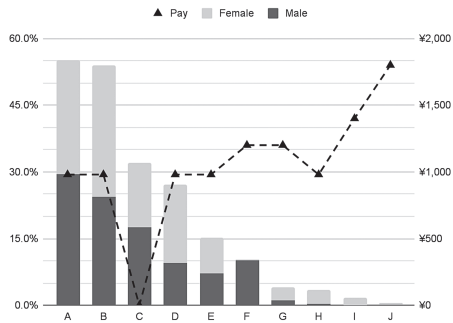

We asked 1,000 students about their part-time jobs



It is very common for Japanese university students to have a part-time job, either on the weekend or in the evenings. We asked them where they worked, and how much they were paid per hour.

The most common jobs were in convenience stores. More women than men worked at 7-Eleven, but more men than women worked at Lawson. The second most common place to work for women was at McDonalds, followed by Uniqlo. Uniqlo and McDonalds were also common workplaces for the men, but food delivery cyclists were slightly more common. It was also a better paid job, if you can get lots of deliveries. But, maybe because it meant cycling around late at night alone, no women had this job.

The two highest paid jobs were the least common: Starbucks and Tokyo Disneyland. The three students working at TDL received almost ¥2,000 per hour, and the eight women working in Starbucks were paid ¥1,400 per hour. Cram schools paid better than local restaurants. Local restaurants paid the same as the convenience stores, ¥980 an hour. All of the students working earned more than the large group of students who did not work at all.

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V 次の英文を読み、後の問いに答えなさい。

The last couple of years has proven how useful the internet can be, allowing people to study, work, shop and play from the safety of their homes. The internet has been around for a long time, but is constantly developing.

The first modern computer network was developed by the USA in the 1960s, called the ARPANET. It ( 1 ) universities and government research centers to share information and ideas over a computer network, but it was very limited. A few large companies set up their own networks to speed up the movement of information inside the company. But, these were closed networks, called intranets - they only worked inside the company, and the system to connect the computers was often (2) unique to that company.

In the 1970s, two American scientists called Vint Cerf and Bob Kahn, developed a method - or protocol - called TCP/IP that allowed networks to connect to each other smoothly. Computers with different operating systems on different networks could now share information. On January 1st 1983, ARPANET and other US government networks started using TCP/IP. This is seen by many as the birth of the internet as we know it today, and Cerf and Kahn are often called the fathers of the internet. The protocol they developed became the standard for all networks around the world, allowing for information to spread quickly and easily. But, the internet was not ( 3 ) quite what we think of it today.

The World Wide Web, which most people today think of when they think of the internet, was not invented until 1989, by Tim Berners-Lee. He made a language that allowed information to be displayed on web pages to be read in a browser, making it much ( 4 ) for people without any technical knowledge to use the internet. This allowed new companies - Google, Facebook and Amazon - to set up websites and services that changed the way we communicate, shop, work and play. It also led to an (5) explosion in the number of billionaires in the world, and the amount of power they and their companies have over our lives and privacy. More and more people and governments are concerned about the wealth and power of these "masters of the internet", which may mean that the internet will change again in the future. One of these people includes Berners-Lee, who has not profited from his creation, and in fact gifted it to the world as a way of spreading knowledge.
