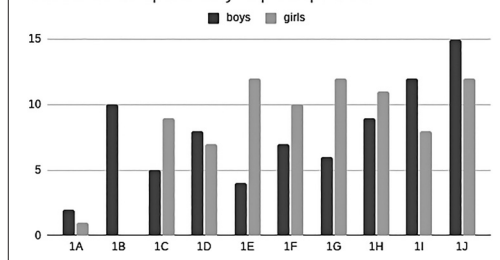
We asked all the boys and girls in the third year at our school what sports they participate in and what sports they watch on TV, YouTube, or any other platform. In our year there are 60 boys and 65 girls. Many of the students said they play and watch more than one sport. We have put the results together in two charts.

We found that the most popular sport for both boys and girls to play was badminton, but the most popular to watch — again for both boys and girls — was baseball. However, none of the girls played baseball. We also found that the least popular sport for both watching and participating in was karate, with only one girl watching it. Interestingly, none of the boys said they watched badminton on TV. The second most popular sport for boys to both play and watch was soccer. For girls, the second most popular sport to watch was basketball, followed by volleyball. Furthermore, an equal number of girls played both sports.

Although almost as many girls did swimming as boys, none of the girls watched it. And, even more surprisingly, though more girls than boys did track and field, none of them watched it. Tennis was the second most popular sport for girls to play, but only two girls watched it, making it the fourth least popular sport to watch for girls.

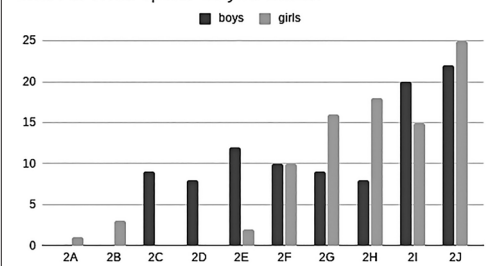
Finally, seven boys and ten girls reported not playing any sports, and an equal number of boys and girls said they didn't watch any sports.

There have been a few inventions that have completely changed society. These (19) things like the automobile, the washing machine, and the airplane. Another invention that helped change society is the sewing machine. This freed women from hours of hard work making and repairing clothes, and allowed for business people to mass produce clothes that meant women did not have to make clothes for their families and themselves. A shirt could be made in an hour or two instead of the fourteen hours it took to make by hand. Inventors across Europe and the USA had been working on sewing machines for decades, but nobody had got it quite right. The first successful sewing machine was invented in the US, known as the Singer Standard No. 1, and was first made available in the early 1850s. Although a simple and basic machine, it is (20) not so different from the machines that are used today.

Very quickly, other companies started making their own sewing machines. Singer became the most (21) sewing machine manufacturer. This was not because they were the best or cheapest, however. Many of its rivals had better designs and better factories using modern techniques. Singer sewing machines continued to have hand-made parts for many years. A lot of its success was due to advertising and marketing. The advertisements told how fast and easy they were to use, and how much money you could make from them. The company rented shop windows in New York and other major cities and had young women using the sewing machines. They gave demonstrations at local fairs around the country. They had agents who would set up your new sewing machine in your house and show you how to use it. But, most significantly of all, they invented an equally important idea known as hire purchase. This allowed families to rent the sewing machine for a little each month, and when the total paid equaled the full price, the sewing machine was (22). If they were unable to continue paying or did not want it anymore, they would just return the machine. This meant poor and middle class families could buy and use the expensive machine without having to save up. Women were able to make and repair clothes for their family and for other people, earning money for their family as well as paying for the sewing machine. By 1860, the sewing machine was (23) celebrated for freeing women from hours of terrible hard work.

However, the inventor, Isaac Merritt Singer, did not start off trying to help women. He was only interested in making money from his inventiveness. His earlier inventions had failed to make him any money, so he was very pleased with the success of the sewing machine. He was, in many ways, an unpleasant person. He had 22 children and three families — all at the same time, and often treated the women in his life very badly. He was not interested in helping women and was only interested in making money. This is a good example of how positive social change can be brought about by selfish people.
